



Trash Toss

Trash Toss is a corn-hole style game to engage youth and adults around proper waste disposal behavior. Each corn-hole set comes with one board and 5 bean bags and there are a total of two sets. You can use a single board or both depending on how many people you expect at the event. To play:

- Set up one or both corn-hole sets by carefully bending the legs out from behind the board.
- Angle the board towards the players.
- Use tape or another marker to establish 2 – 4 tossing lines.
- Once they have chosen a tossing line, give bean bags to players.
- Players look at the picture on the bean bag and decide if that item belongs in the “Trash”, “Compost” or “Recycling”.
- Players then aim for the appropriate hole on the board.
- For each correct hole, players get 1 point.

Bean bags belong in the following:

- Trash: plastic bag, Styrofoam take-out container, empty chip bag
- Compost: apple core, banana peel
- Recycling: can, glass bottle, plastic bottle, newspaper, empty cereal box

Do's and don'ts:

- Do allow kids under 3 or 4 to toss the bean bags without aiming for particular holes
- Don't use Trash Toss outside when it's wet or muddy
- Do let youth and adults select which tossing line they want to stand at
- Do encourage older youth to have a competition between each other
- Don't get too caught up in the scoring
- If you have prizes, do give them to everyone
